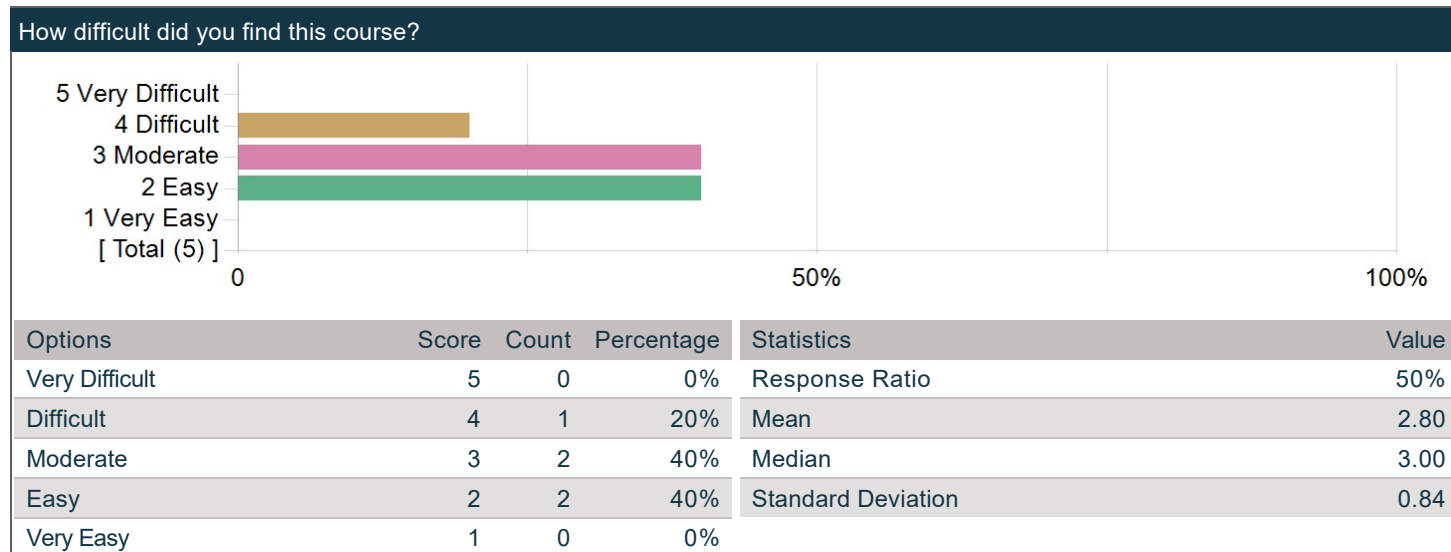

## How difficult did you find this course?

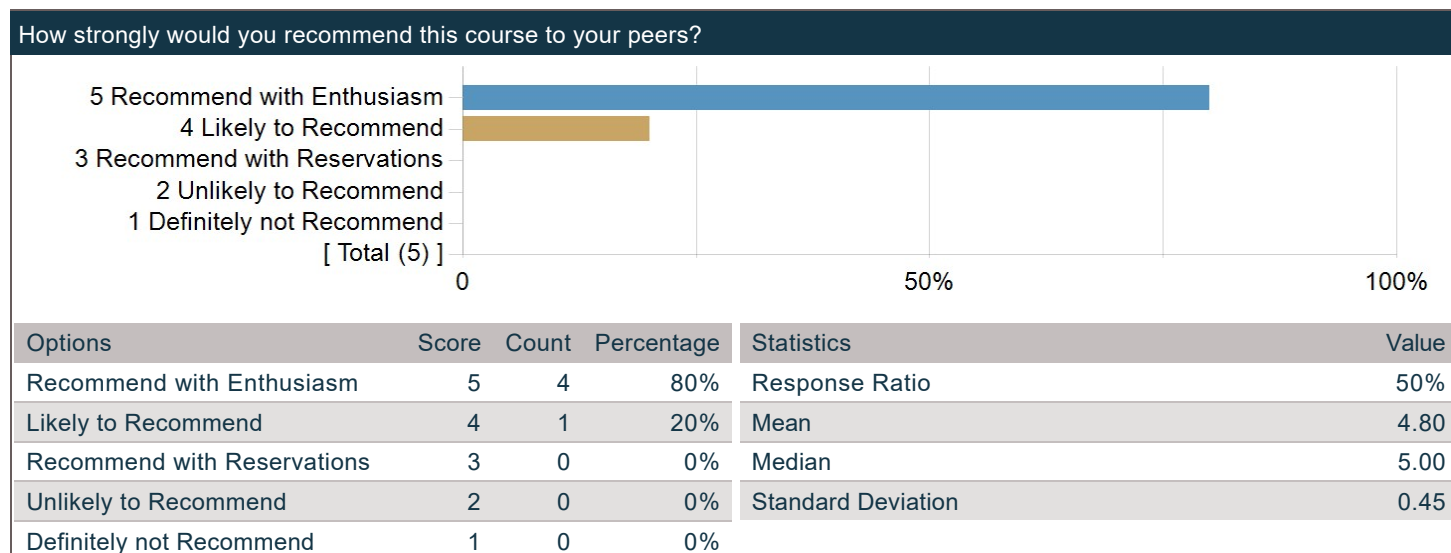

I now feel confident in my ability to critique scientific writing and for myself to write!

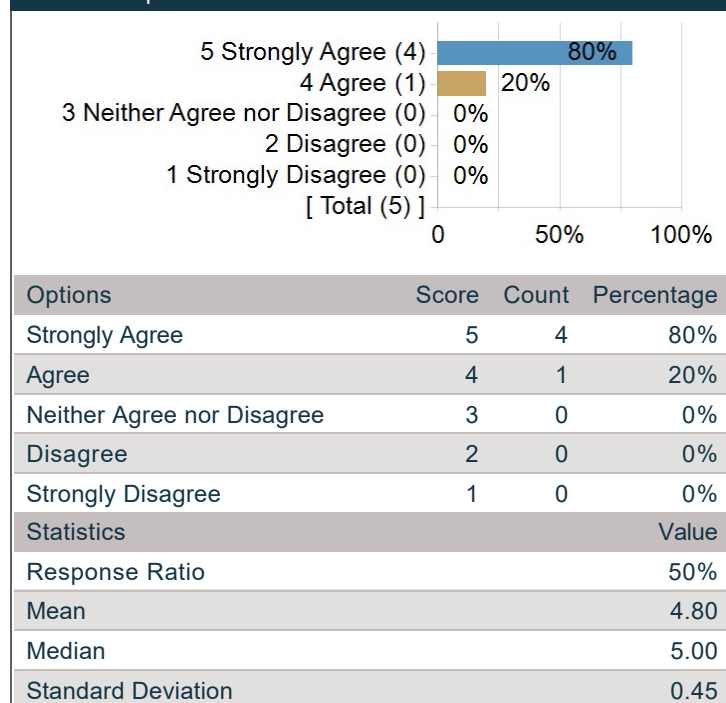

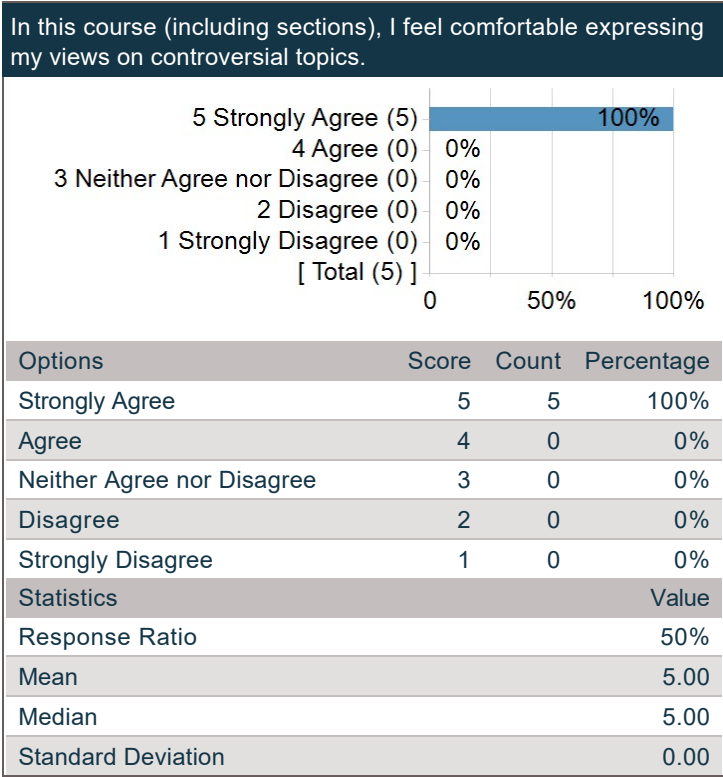
